



State Broadband Leaders Network

- SBLN: a community of practitioners who work on state broadband initiatives. Outgrowth of State Broadband Initiative Program under BTOP.
- SBLN participants share priorities and best practices and discuss emerging telecommunications policy issues.
- SBLN also provides a forum to strengthen policy and program connections among states, local jurisdictions and federal agencies
- Growth in state broadband initiatives:
 - Fifteen states in 2017
 - Forty-six states and territories in 2019

States with Broadband Funding Programs






NTIA's Federal Funding Guide Advises Communities On Accessing Federal Funding For Broadband Projects

The publication provides a list of key federal programs that offer funding for broadband-related projects and includes:

- *Information regarding the purpose of each program*
- *Potential restrictions on funding*
- *Rules for eligibility*



Several federal agencies have resources that can be used for broadband planning and deployment initiatives

HUD's Community Development Block Grant Program can be used for broadband deployment efforts in HUD supported housing programs

Housing & Urban Development (HUD)



EDA's Economic Adjustment Assistance Program can be used for broadband planning efforts as part of an economic development strategy

Economic Development Administration (EDA)



USDA's ReConnect Rural Broadband Program can be used for broadband infrastructure deployment efforts in rural communities

USDA
Rural Utilities Service
(RUS)



USDA's Rural Utilities Service provides loans and loan guarantees to fund broadband in eligible areas

Telecommunications Infrastructure Loan Programs

- Targeted towards rural areas with a population of 5,000 or less
- Partnerships with other federal, state, local, private and non-profit entities are encouraged

Farm Bill Broadband Loans Programs

- Targeted towards rural areas with a population of 20,000 or less
- Areas wherein at least 15 percent of households in the proposed funding area are unserved
