#### ◆ Revenue and Finance

The 2017/18 session saw several pieces of legislation with a significant impact on municipal revenues. HB 61 positioned the State of Georgia to begin collecting sales tax from remote sellers in January of 2019, whereas HB 811 would allow the Department of Revenue to enter into an agreement with a data analytics firm to identify businesses that do not remit all or part of their taxes owed. Both bills have the potential to increase municipal revenues by hundreds of millions of dollars. Representative Jay Powell and Senator Chuck Hufstetler championed these pieces of legislation in their respective chambers and will be on hand to discuss past legislation and provide an outlook on the upcoming session. Ed Braswell of G2Lytics, a data analytics firm that assists governments in identifying underpayment of taxes, will provide an update of what

his company provides and when we can expect a product like his to be used in Georgia.

Striking the right balance between our living environment and bustling business enterprises has always been a challenge. While our state has done a great job cleaning up our waterways, setting a path forward to reduce wasteful practices, and encouraging equitable standards for infrastructure funding through our state water plan, there remains much to be done to keep Georgia ahead of other states in both business and environmental planning. China's new quality standards for incoming waste have impacted the solid waste industry across the country and the ability to recycle certain materials economically. Landfill capacity in the Metro Atlanta region must be expanded in the coming years or the cost to haul waste will certainly increase. These challenges may have a silver lining for our state. Representative Lynn Smith and Senator Tyler Harper, respective Chairs of the House and Senate Committees on Environment and Natural Resources, will discuss these issues and give an update on the legislative session. Andrew Morris, Natural Resources Policy Officer with the Atlanta Regional Commission, will discuss the new water runoff standards for 2020, and Sarah Visser, Georgia's Environmental Protection Division Land Protection Branch Assistant Chief, will give a departmental update.

#### ◆ Transportation Room 209-211

Mobility is the oil for Georgia's economic engine, and local governments are responsible for maintaining over 100,000 miles of roads, accounting for 86% of all the roads in the state. These local roads, streets and bridges are vital to moving people and goods throughout the state. As our state leaders strive to maintain Georgia's reputation as the number one state in the country to do business, the demands on our infrastructure are growing and the funding is not growing at the same rate. The Local Maintenance and Improvement Grant (LMIG), available to assist local governments with mainly repaving projects, has grown since the 2015 transportation legislation raised overall revenue, but is the LMIG formula maximizing the state's interests to build

capacity and target congestion? Additionally, the emerging consensus among state leadership is that mass transit investments in metro Atlanta and in the rest of the state are necessary for Georgia's economic competitiveness. Legislators and transportation experts will discuss tools to reduce congestion in urban areas and provide mobility solutions in rural areas. LMIG funding, transit governance, and rural transportation options will be a focus.






